About this course

Build your future with a carpentry and joinery apprenticeship.

The Certificate III in Carpentry and Joinery must be completed as part of an apprenticeship, and upon successful completion, allows participants to work as a qualified carpenter and joiner. Apprentices will learn through a combination of on-the-job training and block training at North Regional TAFE.

Throughout this course, participants will be trained to work on dwelling up to two-stories high. Participants will acquire skills that enable them to specialise in both carpentry and joinery required to construct residential dwellings.

Participants will learn how to:

- Use carpentry tools and equipment
- Read and interpret plans
- Carry out measurements and calculations
- Carry out general demolition of minor structures
- Install flooring systems
- Construct wall and ceiling frames
- Erect roof trusses and construct pitched roofs and eaves
- Carry out simple concreting
- Follow OH&S procedures and requirements

- Work safely at heights
