



### FACILITIES:

### **Electrical and Instrumentation Training Centre**

The Electrical and Instrumentation Training Centre in Karratha supports the delivery of training, through the use of the latest interactive computer-based training aides, training rigs and instrumentation.

#### **Salon 700**

We operate a state-of-the-art hair and beauty training salon in Karratha. This encompasses modern hairdressing, beauty therapy and manicure stations, along with a classroom replicating a working environment.

### Health and Community Services Centre

The Health and Community Services Training Centre at our Pundulmurra (South Hedland) campus allows nursing, aged care, childcare and community services students to gain hands-on, practical experience in a state-of-the-art simulated environment.

#### **Industry Skills Centres**

Industry Skills Centres support the delivery of essential training to tradespeople employed in mining, construction, and logistics industries. These centres deliver courses in firefighting, forklift operation, rigging and dogging, scaffolding, working at heights, and working in confined spaces.

#### **NDIS Training Facilities**

National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) facilities have been purpose built in Karratha to accommodate simulated training. Each facility has two areas catering for residential care, manual handling, disabilities, infection control and the home environment.

The recently upgraded Minurmaghali Mia (Roeburne) Campus has an NDIS training room with specialised training equipment that is commonly used in the home or a health facility environment.


#### **Trades Training Areas**

These facilities have been built to industry standard with large workspaces and cutting-edge technology in each of the classrooms. In 2023, Pundulmurra Campus saw significant investment in trade training facilities, including a new fitting and engineering workshop, heavy auto mobile plant workshop and light auto workshop extension and upgrade. Balu Buru is a 20-hectare site at 12 Mile in Broome where horticulture and conservation and ecosystem management training is carried out. Opportunities at this location include research trials cultivating local super food Gubinge and fire management training for remote Aboriginal communities.

#### Hospitality and Commercial Cookery – Mayi Nganyjal


The new hospitality and commercial cookery buildings in Broome and Kununurra offer students hands-on training in a world-class facility. The facility supports students to gain industry experience in a practical environment designed to replicate a restaurant and café space with brand new training equipment.

#### **Trades Training Areas**

#### **NDIS Training Facilities**

#### **Short Courses**

Provide hands-on training in a new skill that can be used in a personal or professional context. They are a great way to refresh knowledge or experience a taste of another industry. Short Courses are non-accredited and result in a Certificate of Participation.

#### **Skill Sets**

Are single units of competency or combinations of units of competency which link to a licencing or regulatory requirement, or a defined industry need. They can be nationally recognised Skill Sets, which are endorsed in national training packages. They can also be state or locally developed Skill Sets using nationally recognised units of competency designed to meet training needs of the state or region.

#### **Certificate I**

Helps you to develop the foundation skills required for initial employment, community involvement and/or further study.

#### **Certificate II**

Provides you with the basic knowledge and skills to undertake employment in a defined context. Studying a Certificate II may include undertaking a Traineeship with an on-the-job component.

#### **Certificate III**

Helps you to develop strong skills in a range of occupational areas. Certificate III courses can often be completed as part of an Apprenticeship or Traineeship.

#### Certificate IV

Teaches supervisory and advanced technical skills, which may build on skills you have already acquired in the workplace through a Certificate III or an equivalent.

#### Diploma

Prepares you for work that requires a broad range of complex technical skills and in-depth knowledge. Diploma courses often include management, planning and evaluation, budgeting and finance training and equip you with the higher-level knowledge and skills of your chosen vocational area.

#### **Creating a USI**

Keep your training records secure

Before enrolling in a Vocational Education and Training (VET) course, you require a Unique Student Identifier (USI). Your USI account contains your nationally recognised training records and results, which you can access anywhere in Australia. Create your USI online at usi.gov.au and provide your USI to us upon enrolment.

#### **Recognition of Prior Learning**

#### Gain credit for your pre-existing skills

We recognise that people gain skills and knowledge in a variety of ways. Many highly skilled people have developed their abilities through pathways other than formal education, such as paid employment, community work, volunteering and informal training.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) provides you with an opportunity to have your pre-existing skills recognised in a nationally accredited system. You could then be eligible to gain partial or full credit for your pre-existing skills, helping to fast track your Qualification. As part of the RPL process, an assessor will work with you to identify whether your skills meet industry standards, and if any further training is required.

Contact us to receive a self-assessment checklist and arrange an appointment time to speak with a lecturer about your relevant skills and knowledge. You can prepare for your talk by gathering any documentary evidence you may have to support your claim, including job descriptions, records of employment, references from employers and any other relevant details



#### **VET Delivered to Secondary Students**

The Vocational Education and Training (VET) Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS) program enables students to gain a qualification as part of their senior secondary education. Students in Years 10, 11 and 12 can complete courses while working towards their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

#### Why should I take part in the **VETDSS** program?

- You will gain real life experience with industry experts, developing your work, employability and life skills
- · You will increase your self-esteem, confidence and communication skills
- VET courses delivered as part of this program can lead you to immediate employment or further education including Diplomas or university studies

#### **School Based Apprenticeships** and Traineeships

We offer programs where students can start as a Trainee or Apprentice while still at school. School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships are paid employment based training arrangements formalised in a National Training Contract made between the employer and the student (and guardian).

#### What does School Based Apprenticeships and **Traineeships involve?**

Students will undertake a variety of study at school, training with NR TAFE and will be contracted to work and train with an employer. This gives students the chance to complete the requirements of a nationally recognised Qualification and gain valuable work experience, while still graduating from school with their WACE.



#### How to enrol in a **VETDSS Oualification**

- Students must first be enrolled and attending high school in Years 10, 11 or 12
- · Make an appointment to speak to your school's VET Coordinator about the VET Qualifications available to senior students at your school
- Discuss career goals with parents/caregivers and teachers, then advise your school VET Coordinator of your preferences
- · Apply to your school to secure a place



#### **Aboriginal School Based Training**

Aboriginal School Based Training (ASBT) provides opportunities for Aboriginal students in Years 10 - 12 to gain a VET Qualification. The program engages and encourages students to learn about the world of work, workplace expectations, explore careers and training areas, as well as undertake real or simulated work projects. Schools have the opportunity to apply for this training each year.



#### **Pre-Apprenticeships in school**

Pre-Apprenticeship students attend school, train at NR TAFE and are linked to an employer for work placement. Students must complete a work placement as nominated in the Pre-Apprenticeship program. We will coordinate work placements in partnership with the school.



#### Leaving school

Students can leave school as long as they participate in an approved study/training option considered full time. This means students can study with us full time, undertake a combination of TAFE and employment, or even take on an Apprenticeship or Traineeship.

For students in Years 9 and 10 (students up until the year in which they turn 15 years old), an exemption may be applied. If in Year 11 and 12, a Notice of Arrangement can be applied for. This allows students to enter into an alternative arrangement other than school. These include participating in engagement programs, certificates in general education to improve numeracy and literacy, full and part Qualifications, as well as Skill Sets.

If you are a Western Australian resident, the State Government may subsidise your training. The State Government sets the fees charged at each Qualification level and, in general, you pay lower fees for introductory Qualifications and higher fees for higher-level Qualifications.

#### Payment plans
